Extra Curricular Clubs and Activities

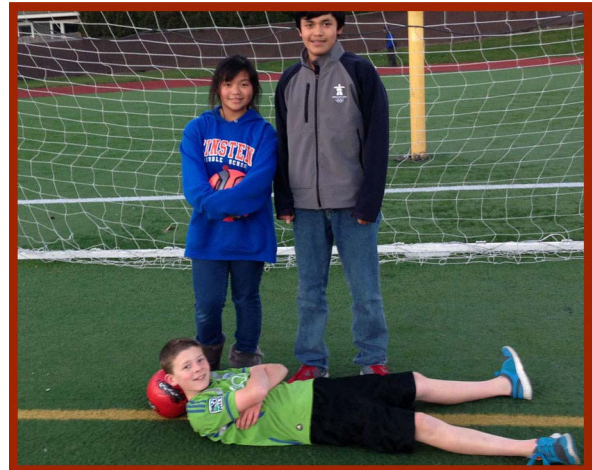

Principal Clark's *Comments*

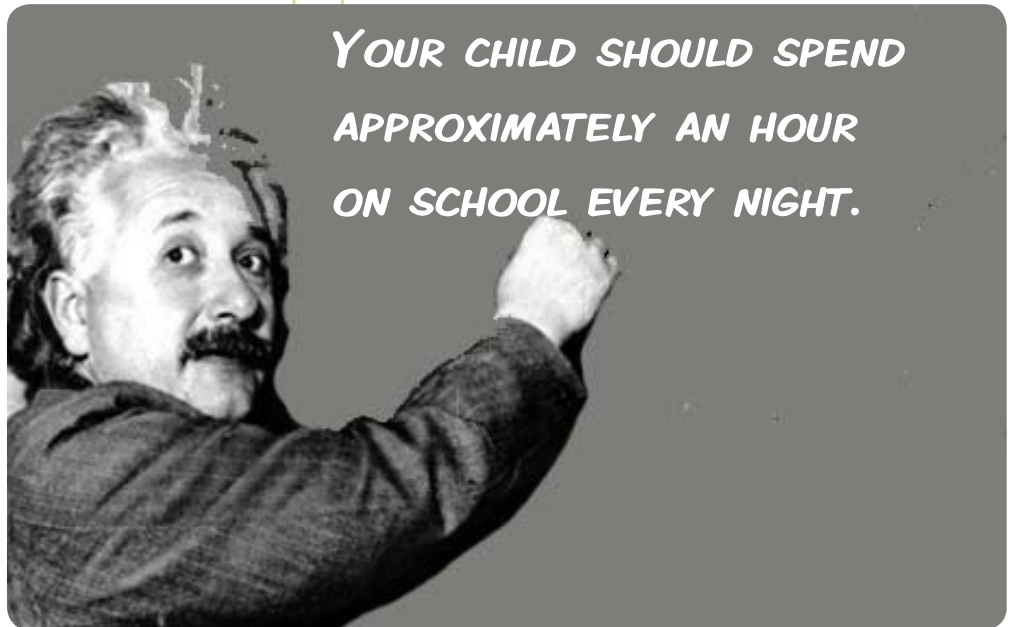
Don't forget your teenager needs your guidance and support...even though they don't act like it!

I want to take a moment to remind you that second trimester seems to be more difficult for teachers and students to get- and stay- in the routine and flow of teaching and learning. Not only do we stop for Winter Vacation, take a day to honor MLK, take another day for a teacher in-service but yes, believe it or not we are only two weeks away from mid-winter break. All of these interruptions can throw even the best students off their "A" game. Your adolescents need consistency and routine in their lives in order to be successful. I highly encourage you to stay consistent with homework and bedtime rituals throughout the school year. **Your child should spend approximately an hour on school every night.** Students will not always have a homework assignment due the next day, but students should spend time organizing notebooks, reviewing the day's learning, replenishing backpacks with school supplies, and updating planners nightly. Students should check and double check teacher websites for upcoming assignments or due dates.

I know middle school students are not always forthcoming about the happenings at school, but the school planner, notebooks, and teacher websites should provide you with some strong clues to what is going on in your teenager's daily life – and provide you with information you can use to spark a conversation with your teen. I understand that when most teens are asked, "What did you learn in school today?" they often respond with a stare, a shrug or a grunt that sounds like... "I don't know." I know that at times talking to your teenager seems impossible... but please don't give up. Your child needs you and values your guidance through his or her secondary school experience. They may not always know

how to show they appreciate you, but they do... and they will remember your efforts through this important phase of their life.

If you do not always have technology available at home, encourage your child to use the library. The Einstein Library opens up daily at 8:00 AM, is open at lunch, and stays open after school until 4:30 PM on Tuesday and Thursday. Students can also access technology during PRIDE on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday.

Replacement Levies

Remember to vote – February 11, 2014!

The Shoreline School Board has unanimously approved placing two replacement levies for voter approval on the Feb. 11, 2014, special election ballot. The District projects that these replacement levies will allow for continued stability of school tax collections for the next four years.

Proposition 1 is Replacement of an Expiring Levy for Educational Programs, Maintenance and Operations.

The Shoreline School District’s current four-year educational programs, maintenance and operations levy will expire at the end of 2014. This levy provides the District with approximately 26 percent of its General Fund operating revenue.

The levy pays for the basic education programs not supported by state and federal funding, including nurses, family advocates, librarians and instructional materials. It helps support smaller class sizes, special education, highly capable, remedial and vocational education programs, building maintenance and utilities, and transportation. Funds are also used to support extra-curricular student activities, including music, drama and athletics.

Proposition 2 is Replacement of an Expiring Capital Levy for Technology Improvements and Support.

A four-year Capital Levy for Technology Improvements and Support would be used to meet the District’s ongoing technology needs for capital improvements. This includes student computers and expanded online curriculum for classroom use, instructional specialists, equipment upgrade and replacement (including lab and library

computers, printers, classroom audio-visual equipment), professional development and training, server and network replacements and upgrades, administrative software systems, online and subscription resources, and virus and firewall protection.

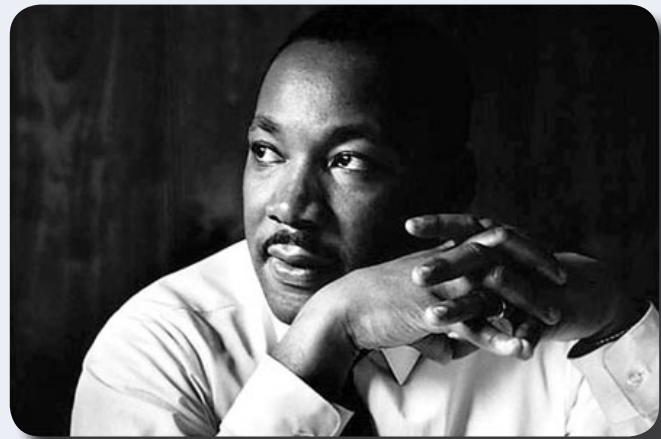

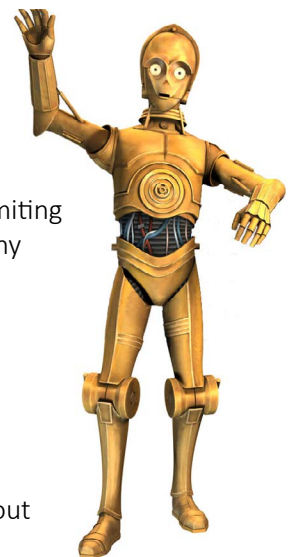

Robotics Competition Comes to Shorewood High School

This is the sixth year that Team Pronto 3070, Shorewood High School's robotics team, will participate in the **FIRST® Robotics Competition**. This event has traditionally been held in venues such as CenturyLink Field, Key Arena, etc. But for the first time, this event will be taking place at the newly built Shorewood High School on **March 21 and 22, 2014**. Robots from more than 30 other teams will compete with and against each other in this year's game called **Aerial AssistSM**, in which the objective is to score as many goals as possible during a two-and-a-half minute match. The game was kept a secret until it was revealed at the Kickoff on January 4th. Each team is given only six weeks to design and build a robot, while adhering to strict guidelines limiting size, weight, and cost along with many other technical stipulations.
