## Hang Time at Einstein!!

### *Hang Time Overview*

Einstein is excited to be offering Hang Time for the first time this year. Hang Time is a new extensive after school activity program, **which encompasses ALL of our after school activities and clubs!!** In order to participate in an Einstein club or after school activity, students must register for Hang Time. While Hang Time does not include athletic participation, it does include athletic event attendance. If students want to cheer on their classmates, they need to **register for Hang Time!!** If students want to participate in an after school club, they need to **register for Hang Time!!**

### *Hang Time Information*

This is a joint venture staffed by Einstein Middle School, The City of Shoreline, and the YMCA. Hang Time will begin on September 20th and meets Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday from 3:05 – 4:45 PM. To participate in Hang Time, students must have submitted a completed [Hang Time Registration Form](#) and have paid the ASB (Associated Student Body) fee. The ASB funds these clubs, activities and sports. In order to support these programs students are required to purchase an ASB card if participating in activities. Scholarships are available. See the attendance secretary in the main office for more information and registration forms.

### *After-School Activity/Athletic Transportation*

Activity buses for Hang Time participants will be available regularly starting Tuesday, September 20th. Students participating in fall sports will have a special fall sports activity bus starting on September 8th (first day of practice). Buses leave the bus loading zone in front of the gym at 4:45 p.m. **These buses are for athletes or students signed in through Hang Time ONLY!**



For many years, Einstein has used the acronym P.R.I.D.E. as guidelines for student success. P.R.I.D.E. stand for PREPARATION, RESPECT, INTEGRITY, DETERMINATION, and EXCELLENCE. Each month we focus on one of these words and we help our Einstein students show PRIDE in all that they do. As it's the start of a new school year, it's natural that PREPARATION is our first focus! We want all of our students to be prepared daily and to learn tools and knowledge that will help them be prepared in high school, college and careers!

At Einstein, being prepared means:

- Being on time! Zero period starts at 7:30 and 1<sup>st</sup> period starts at 8:30. All students should be on campus at least five minutes before their first class.
- Using planners as an organizational tool in each period every day.
- Using your binder to organize assignments and class work.
- Being ready to actively participate, discuss, and ask questions in class.
- Using the restroom between classes and during lunch.

We hope parents will help their Einstein students be PREPARED by establishing the following routines:

We have plenty of extra supplies available at school if you need any of these items. Please ask!</li> <li>· Homework routines should be consistent. Welcome to the Einstein library for what I believe is going to be a fabulous year filled with research, literature, information literacy, and fun! Here are some important things to know as school gets started:

**Library Hours** 8:00am–3:30pm daily. We open half an hour before school and stay open at least half an hour after school, usually longer. We are also open for the second half of each lunch period. Students are welcome to talk to the librarian about arranging other times to use library space and materials.

**Library Website** This year the library website has been re-designed. I hope that you find the format easy to use. Please don't hesitate to contact me with any questions or suggestions for improvement! On the website you will find a general overview, links to all my information literacy documents and videos (which are useful for research and projects!), book lists if you want reading suggestions 24/7, and a section called tools which has links to databases, bibliography tools, etc. I'm also hoping to continually post pictures of students using the library and it's resources.

**Library Materials** The library has a wide range of resources available for student use. We have roughly 15,000 fiction, non-fiction, reference, and journal titles—almost all of which are available for checkout. Parents and guardians are also welcome to checkout library materials; just come into the library so we can set up an account for you! In addition, the library has computers, printers, and a scanner to help with homework completion.

**Printer Cartridge Recycling** If you have used printer/ink cartridges that you would like to recycle, please send them to the library. We work with an agency that collects the cartridges and gives us money in return. We use this money to buy new materials for the library. Anything you can send our way would be greatly appreciated.

**Volunteers** We would love to have parent volunteers in the library! Projects include shelving books, repairing books, and looking for lost books. No need for prior experience or a set schedule. Please email me if you are interested in helping out.

I am really looking forward to another great year of working with all the students here at Einstein. Being the librarian is the best job there is; I get to work with all the teachers and students in different capacities. I love to read and recommend books—we've got all levels, genres, and interests covered. I also enjoy helping students with research, using technology, and getting the information they want and need. We are continually adding new titles and evaluating websites for content to support our curriculum. ## NURSE

**Medication at School:** In the event that there exists a valid health reason, which requires the administration of any medication to a student during school hours, the following procedures will apply.

**Over-the-counter medication.** A parent or legal guardian and a health care provider (physician, dentist or nurse practitioner) must authorize, in writing, the administration of any over-the-counter medication, herbal medication or essential oils. The medication must be provided in the original, labeled container. Unidentified medication may not be administered.

**Prescribed medication.** A parent or legal guardian and a health care provider (physician, dentist or nurse practitioner) must authorize, in writing, the administration of medication. The medication must be provided in the original, labeled container. This authorization will be effective for the current school year unless a shorter period is specified.
