Welcome to the 2015–2016 School Year!

On behalf of the entire Einstein team, I want to welcome each and every one of you to a brand new school year. I am so incredibly honored and excited to continue my work with this school, this year as your Principal. When I joined the Einstein team two years ago, I remember telling my family and friends that I felt like I had found my home. I love this school, I love being part of this community, and from the bottom of my heart I appreciate the trust you all place in us when you send your children through our doors. The entire Einstein staff has been working hard to welcome your students and to make this year an incredible year for learning and growth.

We have several new faces joining us at Einstein this year! The fabulous Rebbecah Emanuel is joining us as our new Assistant Principal. Rebbecah is a top-notch educator who has been serving students and their families since 1998. After twelve years as a music teacher (K-12), Rebbecah became an athletics director, activities coordinator, and ASB/leadership teacher. For the last three years, Rebbecah has been working as a dean, first at Nathan Hale High School and, most recently, at Shorewood High School. Rebbecah has two daughters attending Meridian Park and is absolutely thrilled to be working in collaboration with the Einstein team in anticipation of their arrival in just a few short years! We are lucky to have her joining our team.

I am also very proud to introduce the following teachers who will also be joining Einstein this year:

For many years, Einstein has used the acronym P.R.I.D.E. as guidelines for student success. P.R.I.D.E. stands for PREPARATION, RESPECT, INTEGRITY, DETERMINATION, and EXCELLENCE. Each month we focus on one of these words and we help our Einstein students show PRIDE in all that they do. As it's the start of a new school year, it's natural that PREPARATION is our first focus! We want all of our students to be prepared daily and to learn tools and knowledge that will help them be prepared in high school, college and careers!

At Einstein, being prepared means:

- Being on time! Zero period starts at 7:30 and 1st period starts at 8:30. All students should be on campus at least five minutes before their first class.
- Using planners as an organizational tool in each period every day.
- Using your binder to organize assignments and class work.
- Being ready to actively participate, discuss, and ask questions in class.
- Using the restroom between classes and during lunch.

We hope parents will help their Einstein students be PREPARED by establishing the following routines:

- Eating breakfast at home or participating in our breakfast program in the cafeteria.
- Make sure your child has a lunch and bottle of water or lunch money. Free and reduced lunch packets are available in the office.
- Bring a water bottle to school. We have several hydration stations where they can be refilled, limiting the impact on our environment.
- Designate a time to organize backpack and notebooks for their 6-period day.
- Check to see if your child is recording homework, classwork, or common themes in the planner. Please know that teachers are giving them time to do this!
- Make sure your child has school supplies: pen, pencils, paper, and calculators are essential.
- Homework routines should be consistent. If your child has no homework that evening, it's a great time to review notes, read a book they love, or look forward to upcoming projects.
- Monitor your child's academic progress with the Data Dashboard.
- If you have questions or need assistance, please contact your student's teachers, counselor, office staff, or administrators. We are here to help!

We are committed to the success of each and every student at Einstein. We look forward to partnering with all of you to make this a year of growth and learning for each one of our 687 students.

LEGISLATIVE NEWS

Welcome Back for the 2015-16 School Year! There is a lot going on in the legislative world, so let's get you caught up. Just the facts:

McCleary Decision

The McCleary Decision determined by the Supreme Court in 2009 was that the Legislature was failing to meet their constitutional obligation to amply fund education. It was determined that to adequately fund basic education, as defined by the Legislature's own study, would cost \$12,546 per student by 2017–18 school year. It was further determined that to reach this goal the legislature would need to hit particular benchmarks over the years to successfully reach this funding. By the end of the 2013-14 school year, the Legislature had not reached its benchmarks and hadn't reached any benchmarks in any previous years since the decision. It was clear that the Legislature was not fulfilling its constitutional obligation to adequately fund basic education. The Supreme Court then decided that it found the Legislature in Contempt of Court for not fulfilling this obligation and consequences for continuing not to reach these benchmarks would be determined after the next budget session. Once again, the Legislature has failed to fund basic education as set forth by these benchmarks. A \$100,000 a week fine was imposed by the court this summer to further compel the Legislature to fulfill their constitutional obligation.

Please note some key elements to the facts: The McCleary Decision did not define Basic Education Funding, the study done by the Legislature determined this and the amount is clearly defined, \$12,546 per student by the 2017–18 school year. Further, the Supreme Court is not determining the state budget; rather, they are enforcing the Constitution of the State of Washington that clearly states that the Legislature will amply fund education for each student in the state. And finally, at just below \$8,000 per student by the end of the 2014–15 school year, with the benchmark clearly defined at \$10,578 per student, the Legislature had, in fact, not met their constitutional obligation. No Child Left Behind (NCLB)

The Shoreline School District failed to gain a waiver this year for NCLB because the state of Washington does not tie principal and teacher evaluations to the results of state testing, based on the NCLB requirement that 100% of students are passing the state tests. Although test scores have increased and graduation rates are on the rise, this requirement to tie testing to principal and teacher evaluations has become mandatory to continue to receive a waiver for not having 100% passing test rates.

If you are interested in learning more or taking action, here are some suggestions to help you work with your school and district to support improvements:

Get involved:

- Talk with district staff about the District Improvement Plan and the program changes that must be made to help students meet the state standards in English language arts and mathematics.
- Visit your child's school. You also may participate in voluntary activities to assist your school.
- If you are a parent of a student who attends a Title I, Part A school in improvement (Step 1–5), ask about school choice options to transfer your child, with paid transportation, to a public school in your local education agency (LEA) that is not identified as a Program Improvement school.
- If you are a parent of a student who attends a Title I, Part A school that is in Step 2–5 of school improvement, ask about supplemental educational services (SES) that may be available for your child. Supplemental educational services are tutoring services provided outside of the regular school day for eligible students.

These suggestions are excerpted from an e-mail from Superintendent Miner, who also says, "I encourage you to contact the Title I office (206) 393-4117 or your school principal for further information about any of these requirements and to find out how you can become involved in district and school improvement efforts."

Welcome to the Einstein library for what I believe is going to be a fabulous year filled with research, literature, information literacy, and fun! Here are some important things to know as school gets started:

Library Hours

8:00am–3:30pm daily. We open half an hour before school and stay open at least half an hour after school. We are also open for the second half of each lunch period. Students are welcome to talk to the librarian about arranging other times to use library space and materials.

Library Website

Here you will find links to the library website, commonly used databases, a bibliography tool, and the latest library news. The “About” page also has general information about library policies. There is also a “Book List” page if students are looking for suggestions for books in a particular genre. While I’m more than happy to give recommendations in person, these are available 24/7. My goal is to post something new on the library website at least three times per week, so feel free to check it regularly.

Library Materials

The library has a wide range of resources available for student use. We have roughly 15,000 fiction, non-fiction, reference, and journal titles—almost all of which are available for checkout. Parents and guardians are also welcome to checkout library materials; just come into the library so we can set up an account for you! In addition, the library has computers, printers, and a scanner to help with homework completion.

Printer Cartridge Recycling

If you have used printer/ink cartridges that you would like to recycle, please send them to the library. We work with an agency that collects the cartridges and gives us money in return. We use this money to buy new materials for the library. Anything you can send our way would be greatly appreciated.

Volunteers

We would love to have parent volunteers in the library! Projects include shelving books, repairing books, and looking for lost books. No need for prior experience or a set schedule. Please [email me](#) if you are interested in helping out.

I am really looking forward to another great year of working with all the students here at Einstein. Being the librarian is the best job there is; I get to work with all the teachers and students in different capacities. I love to read and recommend books—we’ve got all levels, genres, and interests covered. I also enjoy helping students with research, using technology, and getting the information they want and need. Immunization News

Starting Fall 2015, students in 7th and 8th grades will need two doses of the Varicella (Chickenpox) shots. See [this informational flyer](#) from the Washington Department of Health for more information.

Washington state law requires that all children up to the age of 21 be fully immunized on or before the first day of school. Shoreline requires that students must have proof of immunization or an approved waiver by the 20th day of school. If no proof/waiver by the 20th day of school, the student may not continue to attend school until documents received.

This means the school MUST have on file:

- A Certificate of Immunization Form, OR
- A Waiver Form exempting the student from these requirements for medical, philosophical or religious reasons.

NEW requirement for Waiver

A change in the Law enacted in July 2011 requires the Waiver form for newly enrolled students and current students who have new immunization requirements to include a physician's signature for those wishing to exempt for medical or philosophical reasons. A proof of membership in a religious group that does not allow a health care practitioner to provide medical treatment to a child is required for those claiming a religious exemption.

Athletics Registration

We have streamlined our registration process for athletics. All forms are available on the [Einstein Athletics Registration Page](#).

Annually every student participating in sports needs:

- Athletic Contract: Signed by both parent/guardian and student.
- Physical Examination: Completed and turned in before the athlete can participate.
- Concussion Information: Reviewed and signed by both parent/guardian and student.
- Athlete Information & Permission: Completely filled out and signed by parent or guardian.
- Insurance: Required in order to participate in any sports.
- ASB Card: \$25 cash/check made payable to Einstein Middle School.

Each Sports Season every athlete needs:

- Athletics Registration Form: Signed by athlete and parent/guardian. Individual coaches will collect these forms. Do not turn in until coach instructs you to do so.
- Athletic Participation Fee: (\$20 per sport) Cash or checks made payable to Einstein Middle School. Football, Cross Country, Wrestling, and Track are all non-cut sports and the fee is \$20. Girls Softball, Girls Volleyball, Girls and Boys Basketball are all cut sports. For "cut" sports: students will try out for these teams and if they are chosen for the team will pay the \$20 fee. There is no fee to try out. Upon making the team, the \$20 fee will be due prior to the first contest.

8th Grade Football
